Outside-In takes your inaccessible documents and audiovisual media and makes them accessible. We use your documents to provide training and work to youth with episodic disabilities and provide you with a quality-assured accessible file. We also provide web site accessibility reports and can help you understand any changes you should make to your web site to make it accessible and compliant with legislation such as the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act. For Youth with Episodic Disabilities

Outside-In provides free online training in making digital media accessible to youth (ages 13-29) who know or think that they have an invisible or episodic disability that makes it challenging to gain formal training or maintain traditional work hours. This training includes topics such as making digital office documents such as Word and PDF accessible, adding closed captioning to videos and reviewing websites for accessibility. The program is free, online and you work at your own pace under the guidance of a mentor. We provide digital badges for the skills that you learn so that you can show your skills to others. After you have completed the program, you will be supported to find independent work or create a resume to apply for industry jobs. You can train anywhere that you have access to a computer and the Internet. Participants in the program will have access to computers and necessary software at locations in downtown Toronto.

Who Is Eligible

This training program is open to youth 13-29 years old; who self-identify (this means we do not require, a doctor's note or other documents) as having an invisible disability (for example a learning disability or any other type of condition that cannot be seen) or an episodic disability (for example: MS, lupus, or a condition where you sometimes have good days and bad days). No prior experience is needed. However, basic literacy and familiarity with windows operating systems and computers would be an asset.


